

■ DEPORTATION

In 2014, more than 585 people were deported in Saxony, about 9000 in Germany. During deportations people are brought out of the country by use of force by the police. Also sick and elderly people are deported. Families are torn apart. During winter time many people die, as they have no accommodation in the countries they are deported to.

We demand the immediate stop of all deportations!

■ EXCEPTIONAL LEAVE TO REMAIN („DULDUNG“)

People who do not obtain a residence status but cannot be deported either, are provided with an exceptional leave to remain. This means that they must continue living in a refugee camp, that they still have no right to a decent job, a good income or the right to attend language school. Many people are forced to live in this state for decades.

We demand the abolition of this degrading process!

■ RESTRICTED RESIDENCE

During the first three months, asylum seekers and tolerated residents in Germany need a permit from the immigration authorities if they want to leave the borders of the federal state or county in which they live to visit friends or family. In Saxony, people are restricted to the adminis-

trative districts of Dresden, Chemnitz and Leipzig respectively. Afterwards the freedom of movement can still be limited arbitrarily by the authorities.

We demand freedom of movement for all people!

■ WORK AND EDUCATION

Asylum seekers are not allowed to work in the first three months, they are only allowed to do community work for 1,05 Euro/hour. Afterwards they only get a work permit if there is no German or EU citizen who could do the job. Studies or training are usually possible only with a residence permit.

We demand unrestricted access to work and education for everyone!

■ LIVING

During the asylum process, refugees are housed in asylum camps of which there are 8 in Dresden and 51 in Saxony. The camps are often in bad condition and in the middle of nowhere. They offer no privacy at all, as there are always several people living in one room. By law, every refugee has right to 6-8 square meters.

We demand free choice of accommodation!

■ SERVICES

In 2012, the German Federal Constitutional Court decided that allowances for asylum seekers, which had not been raised since 1993, are not sufficient for a life in dignity. The current amount of 359 Euro is still below the poverty line drawn by Hartz-IV. Even after the law reform in 2014, these allowances are often disbursed as vouchers during the first time in the camps.

We demand the abolishment of the voucher system and sufficient financial provisioning!

■ INTEGRATION AND LANGUAGE COURSES

Although communication with the administration happens in German, there is no right to German classes for people without a residence permit during the first three months. Afterwards it is still very difficult to join an integration course. Furthermore, especially mothers are excluded from these language courses, as there is no child care offered in the mean time. Moreover, there is a capacity of 400 course places for more than 2000 refugees. This meets not even 25% (as at february 2015).

We demand immediate and free integration and language courses for all migrants!

■ MEDICAL CARE

Asylum seekers and tolerated residents cannot just get treatment but need permission from social services. By law, only acute pain conditions are treated. Many asylum seekers are traumatized and cannot be treated without psychological care and safety from further persecution.

We demand equal medical treatment for everyone!

■ ON THE RUN

The way into the EU is dangerous and often deadly. At the outer borders refugees are kept away from the EU by border guards, speed boats, helicopters, radar towers, night vision and thermal imaging cameras. The EU annually spends between 90 and 118 million Euro on the the Frontex border agency.

We demand the instant opening of all EU outer borders!

WHAT IS THE NAMF?

The NAMF is a politically independent initiative comprising groups and individuals in Dresden who campaign for the rights of migrants, especially refugees and asylum seekers. We seek to cooperate with concerned people on a level playing field with regard to their general and individual needs. We want to support them in fighting for their own rights.

No one is illegal.

■ COUNTRIES OF ORIGIN AND REASONS FOR FLEEING

Most asylum seekers in Dresden and Saxony are from Syria, the Russian Federation, Eritrea and Tunisia. They flee because of war, persecution, hunger, discrimination and violence. These conditions are also provoked by Germany's policy

We call for the German state to take responsibility and provide a life in dignity and safety!

■ ASYLUM PROCEDURES

The asylum process can take several years and ends with a rejection for most people. In 2014, only 29,5% obtained at least a protection status and thus a temporary residence permit. Those who are rejected and do not leave voluntarily can be deported. Whoever enters Germany through another European country is not entitled to a fair trial and deported in conformity with the Dublin Regulation.

We demand right of residence in Germany for everybody!
